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ROADS:

The following serves as an update to Elected Members on some of the Capital projects for the first three months of 2017 in County Kilkenny:-

Kilkenny Central Access Scheme Phase 2

The construction of the CAS Bridge, under Phase One of this Project, was completed in mid 2016. Phase Two of the scheme provides for the construction of the Central Access Scheme from the west side of the Bridge to St. Canice's Place and from the east side of the Bridge to the Castlecomer Road, including the widening of the Castlecomer Road and the reconfiguration of the New Road Roundabout. Works on this project are nearing completion and it is expected that the new street and bridge will be opened up to the public in May 2017.

N76 Callan Road Realignment Scheme

The contract for the N76 Callan Road Realignment Scheme was awarded to SIAC Construction Limited on the 21st December 2016. This Scheme has been an objective of Kilkenny County Council for many years and there is no doubt, when completed, will greatly enhance the lives of the residents living along the road, improve road safety and provide for a more attractive approach into Kilkenny City.

The scheme itself extends for 4.38km's from the N76 Callan Road Roundabout, on the Ring Road, to the Brownstown Junction. The Scheme provides for the introduction of on-line footpaths/cycle tracks and public lighting from the Ring Road to Tennypark Cross and off-line road realignment between Tennypark Cross and Brownstown Junction. It is noted, a significant number of landowners were affected with respect to the acquisition of the lands required to deliver

this scheme and their co-operation in this respect is acknowledged.

SIAC Construction Limited commenced works on site in February 2017. To-date, at the southern end of the project, a substantial amount of site clearance works has been undertaken off-line along with the erection of new roadside boundary In conjunction with this, online fences. improvement works to facilitate the upgrading of the existing drainage and services network, along with the installation of public lighting and footpaths/cycletracks, between the Callan Road Roundabout and Tennypark Junction are progressing well. The expected works completion date is Quarter 2 of 2018.

N25 New Ross By-pass

Transport Infrastructure Ireland awarded the PPP Contract to a BAM Iridium consortium (the PPP Co.) in January 2016. The PPP Co's contractor for the works is a BAM Civil Ltd and Dragados Ireland Ltd joint venture.

Works commenced on site in February 2016 and the construction period for same is 36 months. Todate the fencing & site clearance element of the project is significantly completed. Works are now focused on earthworks, the provision of road and agricultural underpasses and the installation of stream culverts. With respect to the Barrow Bridge piling and foundation works for the bridge are progressing well.

The 'Pink Rock' Road (LS7512) on the Kilkenny side has also been closed since June and will remain so until June 2017 to facilitate access to the bridge site and also for the construction of a bridge pier. Further traffic management operations will proceed over the coming months, including on the N25 to facilitate the construction of the N25 Glenmore Roundabout.

Quarterly project newsletters are published and circulated widely at public buildings and local conveniences and a dedicated project website <u>www.n25newross.ie</u> has been set-up and provides progress updates as well as information on traffic management and road works. It is anticipated that this project will be completed and open to the public in the first quarter of 2019.

Special Speed limit Bye-laws 2017 for County Kilkenny

Since late 2015 an extensive review and consultation process has been undertaken with respect to the Speed Limit By-laws for County Kilkenny This process concluded on the 20th March 2017 when the said By-laws were ratified by Kilkenny County Council and subsequently came into force on the 31st of March.

Belview Port

In recognition of the strategic importance of the port area, the Kilkenny County Development Plan 2014-2020 has the following objective:

"To develop and agree an appropriate planned policy response to access from the N29 Port Road to industrial zoned lands in the Belview area in conjunction with the National Roads Authority."

In the context of the emerging Ferrybank Local Area Plan (LAP), Kilkenny County Council engaged directly with Transport Infrastructure Ireland (TII), and separately with the Port of Waterford, in order to develop this policy response. The outcome will be presented in the LAP and will include the reduced speed limits at the Port end of the N29 and a reconfiguration of the road layout in the future.

Bus Shelters

It was agreed that Phases 2 & 3 of this Programme will be rolled out over the next 3 years. This Programme includes the provision of 10 no. Shelters/bus stops at seven towns and villages within the County. A tender for the supply of shelters for Phase 2 was awarded recently and the installation of same is expected to commence in Q2 2017. An allocation of $\notin 110,000$ was provided locally for the delivery of same.





<u>TII HD 28 Management of Skid Resistance</u> <u>Programme</u>

Under the 2017 HD28 Programme, Kilkenny Co. Council received a combined Capital allocation of €205,000 to carryout remedial works on the National Road Network. The sections of road to be targeted for treatment were identified by Transport Infrastructure Ireland. In total 18 sites were identified with 16 of same requiring surface re-texturing treatment and this element of the Programme was completed in Quarter 1 2017.

Patrick Street Improvement Works.

Works to underground the existing overhead service network and improve the public lighting along Patrick Street progressed during the first three months of this year. The completion of this work will greatly improve the streetscape by providing clear sky views unobstructed by unsightly wires and cables. This in turn will make for a more attractive place and improve the quality of life for all those living in, and visiting, the area.

HOUSING:

Housing Assistance Payment (HAP)

As of the 1st March 2017, HAP is now available to all eligible households in all 31 local authority areas. Kilkenny was in the first pilot phase and HAP became operational on 1st October 2014. As of 31st March, 771 households are signed up to HAP in County Kilkenny.

7 Houses at the Haven, Newpark

7 houses were completed and allocated as part of a turnkey development at the Haven, Newpark in March 2016.

Repair to Lease Scheme (RLS)

A key component of the Rebuilding Ireland Action Plan for Housing and Homelessness is a new scheme, the *Repair and Leasing Scheme*, recently announced by Mr. Simon Coveney TD, the Minister for Housing, Planning, Community & Local Government.

The Scheme targets owners of vacant properties as a possible source of social housing, enables funding to support necessary repairs to vacant properties and also provides the property owners with an income stream that may, otherwise, be unavailable.

The maximum cost of repairs to a vacant property under the Scheme is $\notin 40,000$.

The Scheme has a number of specific requirements including:

- The property has to be vacant for at least 12 months
- There must be a social housing demand for the property
- The property must be assessed as being viable to provide social housing
- The minimum lease term is 10 years, 15 years or 20 years depending on the cost of the repair works
- The lease payment is based on 80% (85% for apartments) of the current market rental rates in the property location.
- A further adjustment to the lease payment is made to off-set the cost of the repair works until the cost of the works has been repaid.

The benefits of updating the report and restating clearly both tenant and landlords responsibility for maintenance will contribute to greater efficiencies and result in additional monies available for planned maintenance. This in turn will benefit the tenant.

LOCAL INFRASTRUCTURE HOUSING ACTIVATION FUND [LIHAF]

Ministers Coveney and O'Donohoe announced approval to 34 public infrastructure projects in 15 local authority areas aimed to address public infrastructure deficits which is hindering the early development of housing.

Kilkenny County Council made two successful applications to this fund as follows:

1. Western Environs Kilkenny

This application was for the road infrastructure in the Western Environs stretching from the N76 Callan Road to the R695 Kilmanagh Road. The infrastructure will include:

- Distribution Road from the N76 Callan Road to the Circular Road
- Upgrade of the Circular Road to the Kilmanagh Road





 Upgrade of the Kilmanagh Road to the Northern Boundary of the Western Environs.

The total infrastructural cost is approx. $\notin 10m$ with $\notin 5.1m$ being provided under the LIHAF. Consultants have been appointed with a view to preparing tender documentation and it is hoped works will commence by year end. It is estimated that following the provision of the road infrastructure, lands will be released to cater for up to 800 houses in the area by 2021 and 3,000 by 2030

To ensure a sufficient quantum of land is appropriately phased for the development of housing in the Western Environs, a variation to the Western Environs Plan is being prepared. This will facilitate the two schools planned for the area along with re-phasing of housing land for development.

2. Neighbourhood Park, Aylesbury, Ferrybank applications for funding for The a Neighbourhood Park in Ferrybank was made in conjunction with Waterford City and County Council. The Park will include two play areas [multi use games area and outdoor gym] as well as landscaping, planting, seating, lighting and a parking area. Funding of €310,000 is being provided under the LIHAF and both local authorities contributing the balance. The provision of the park will increase the attractiveness of the area facilitating the activation of housing on sites in the area, some of which already have existing planning permission [200 units].

Forward Planning:

- The Council made a comprehensive submission to the National Planning Framework, before the closing date of March 31st. The Planning section was also heavily involved in formulating the Council's submission on the Report of the Waterford Boundary Review Committee.
- The Council also assisted in the preparation of a joint submission to the National Planning Framework on behalf of the 5 local authorities in the South East Planning Area; Kilkenny, Wexford, Waterford, Carlow and Tipperary.
- Work has commenced on the "Urban Design Criteria and Recommended Development Code for the Implementation of the Abbey Creative Quarter Masterplan" by Loci Consultants. A public consultation was held on the 19th April in the Ormonde Hotel.
- Proposals are being formulated on the Urban Design Strategy for the Hebron Road and will be brought to Council for consideration shortly.
- Survey work is underway for the Vacant Sites Register.
- The Draft Ferrybank/Belview LAP is very close to being finalised for publication. The





Council had engagement with IDA in relation to land located at the Belview port. The Council also were having ongoing discussions with TII in relation to access arrangements for the zoned land along the N29. Ongoing engagement took place with Waterford City and County Council in the preparation of the draft LAP and both local authorities were involved in joint public consultation as part of the process to-date. All issues are now close to finality and it is anticipated that a draft plan will be published over the coming weeks.

- Work is also continuing on the preparation of the Draft Castlecomer Local Area Plan for publication through the statutory environmental assessments and compilation of the written plan.
- Work will commence shortly to review of the Thomastown and Callan Local Area Plans.

Housing Developments

7 Developments have been taken in charge during the first quarter of 2017. A total of 238 houses are in these estates.

Work is progressing on a number of other developments with a view to finalising the taking in charge of them during 2017. Works are funded from claims made on the bonds provided.

Conservation:

- The Department of Arts Heritage Regional Rural and the Gaeltacht Affairs announced two conservation grant schemes for remedial works to our built heritage. Applications are being considered for these funds.
 - Application for funding from the Irish Walled Town Network has been made for signage in Kilkenny City.

Draft River Basin Management Plan

A series of public meetings has been organised by Ann Phelan, (Community Water Officer with the Waters and Communities Office) to facilitate community discussion and engagement on the draft River Basin Management Plan 2018 – 2021 which is currently open for public consultation. The first Tidy Towns Forum of 2017 was held on the 28th of March, the Forum members discussed issues relating to their volunteer efforts and also heard from Ms Peacock from the PPN, Mr Horgan from Kilkenny LEADER Partnership and Ms Phelan from LAWCO. The next Forum meeting is scheduled for the 10th of May in Thomastown.

Green Schools

20 schools were visited by the Environmental Awareness Officer in Q1. In addition, the spring education programme was rolled out providing 15 schools environmental workshops on biodiversity, climate change and water conservation.

National Spring Clean

The National Spring Clean campaign kicked off with a strong start, 99 groups were registered by the end of March. The campaign was launched locally on the 28th of March with representatives of tidy town groups.

CORPORATE

Medieval Mile Musuem

Kilkenny's Medieval Mile Museum was officially opened on Tuesday, April 4th by Mr. Patrick O Donovan, Minister of State for Tourism and Sport, in the presence of Cathaoirleach, Cllr Matt Doran and Cllr Patrick O'Neill, Mayor of the Municipal District of Kilkenny City.







Boundary Review

As members are aware following the announcement by Minister Coveney on the 3rd April with regard to the Boundary Review, subsequent media reports have lead to confusion with regard to what is intended by "new management solutions ...to facilitate cohesive expansion of Waterford". At the request of the members a letter was issued to Minister Coveney on the 19th April, 2017, requesting clarification on the matter.

LOCAL ENTERPRISE OFFICE

Quarterly Report – Qtr. 1 2017

- The LEO has approved financial assistance to 6 business totalling €96,875. (1x Feasibility Study, 3x Business Expansion Grants and 2x Priming Grants). There are 7 direct jobs associated with this funding and the associated businesses expect to create 36 jobs over coming 3 years;
- **114 one-to-one mentoring assignments** have been approved to date. The LEO also facilitated five mentoring clinics in Finance and Marketing with 30 attendees;
- 7 Trading Online Vouchers have been approved totalling €14,024;
- 4 Technical Assistance for Micro Exporters Grant totalling €5,762 have been approved;
- 5 businesses have been assisted to make applications for loan funding through the St. Canice's Credit Union Smart Options Loan Scheme and Microfinance Ireland;
- LEO staff have conducted **135 business advisory sessions** with clients offering advice and information LEO services and business start-ups;
- 28 training programmes have been scheduled in the Spring Training Programme with 356 places available for small businesses located in Kilkenny. To date 16 training programmes

have been completed with **170 participants** in attendance;

Kilkenny will be represented at the National Enterprise Awards by Greensbridge Engineering Ltd based in Mullinavat, Co Kilkenny. Greensbridge Engineering Ltd produces high precision stainless steel, super alloy and aluminium components for supply into the oil and gas, medical device and semiconductor technology industries. The company was established in 2011 by Mark Boyne and Richie Kenneally who have a combined experience of over 50 years in the precision engineering sector. In its four years of operation the company has grown steadily and currently employs 7 full-time employees. The Enterprise Office Kilkenny Local has supported their development in the form of grants and also advice and mentoring since their inception;

125 enterprising students from 11 secondary schools across County Kilkenny exhibited at the Student Enterprise Programme County Final held on Wednesday 29th March. In the senior category the winners were Tyler O'Callaghan, Jade Soames, Christian Neagu and Sophie Hartford Reade, students from Kilkenny City Vocational School with their project Seasonal Sensations. Kian Maher and Tomas Sebok from Coláiste Eamann Rís. Callan were presented with the Intermediate category award with their craft business TK Ceramics Ltd. In the Junior category the winners were announced as Aimee O'Brien, Ciara Treacy, Molly Dunne, Emma Cahill and Hannah Wallace with their Fresh Minds project

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from St. Brigid's College, Callan. The three category winners will now prepare for the National Finals which will be held on Wednesday 3rd May in Croke Park.

Kilkenny Welcomes Creative Ireland

The Cultural Services Team of Kilkenny County Council is delighted to be partnering with the national Creative Ireland team to roll-out the Creative Ireland Programme in County Kilkenny. This is a new nationwide culture-based programme, under the auspices of the Department of Arts, Heritage, Regional, Rural and Gaeltacht Affairs, which promotes culture and creativity. Local authorities have a crucial role in the overall local delivery of the entire programme and are specifically mandated to deliver Pillar 2 of the programme – "Enabling Creativity in Every Community". The Creative Ireland Programme builds on work already underway in Local Authorities. Key milestones in 2017 include:

1. Cruinniú na Cásca

The Cultural Services Team of Kilkenny County Council partnered with the Kilkenny Civic Trust to host a free family event on the grounds of the new Medieval Mile Museum, for Cruinniú na Cásca, a new nationwide family



friendly Easter festival.

2. Kilkenny Culture & Creativity Activation Plan 2017

This will include a programme of cultural projects to be completed in 2017, funded by an allocation of \notin 65,000 from Creative Ireland. The Plan will be submitted to the Dept on April 21st.

3. Open meeting to share information about the Creative Ireland Programme.

COMMUNITY AND CULTURE

Quarterly Report January – March 2017

Kilkenny County Council Community and Cultural Facilities Capital Scheme (CCFCS) 2017 is open for applications March- June 9th 2017

- The overall objective of this scheme is to respond to the need for better community, recreational and cultural facilities for community groups through the provision of a capital grant.
- The scheme is open to groups operating within the Community Sector who have a recognised legal structure, operate on a 'not for profit' basis, demonstrate a policy of inclusion and demonstrate the capacity to manage and operate the proposed facilities.
- Level of grant aid available Funding is at a rate of 75% of the total eligible project costs up to a maximum of €45,000. The grant beneficiary will have to provide the remaining 25% match funding. The minimum grant size available is €9000. That means that the total eligible project costs must be at least €12,000.

Kilkenny LCDC: Roll out of DHPCLG's Community Facilities Funding Scheme- April 2017 closing date June 30th

- The funding will, as far as is possible, be evenly dispersed across the 3/4 Municipal Districts giving approximately €16,000 per MD.
- With regards the indicative list of groups that would receive priority in the county under the scheme; disability groups and lone parents were included
- The grant will be offered with a minimum grant of €1000 and a maximum grant of €3,000

- The application form to include a section outlining impacts and outcomes of the project and the funding for the wider community
- The LCDC will accept a **maximum of 2 applications** for different projects from any one organisation – this will limit larger organisation with multiple projects from accessing large amounts of the funding and help to ensure a wider spread of application from a wider variety of groups.
- The scheme will be advertised in the KK People week of April 24; possibly the Munster Express, KCC website and Face book pages, KK PPN website and Facebook pages. Katherine Peacock- Coordinator of the KK PPN will also convene MD meetings over the month of May to disseminate the information with regards the scheme as well as encourage smaller groups to apply and support same.
- A report will be written for the LCDC so they can assess according the criteria set out in the guidelines and make recommendations to the 3 MD's for final decision.

Community Support for Town and Village Renewal Scheme 2016:

• The section continues to facilitate meetings and agreements with the 4 Towns and Villages selected for the scheme. The process Kilkenny has undertaken enables the Council and the community to work in partnership in the delivery of the scheme.

Community Element reporting on the LECP:

The first reporting period on actions outlined in the community element of the LECP has been successful in that a total of 64 on line reporting submissions were made across the 22 agencies, groups or departments listed in the table above. Of the prioritised list of actions only 2 agencies/groups/ departments did not report on their action which is a 91% return rate. There are high levels of success with regards progressing





actions; only 1 agency had 0% progress and this was due to resource issues.

PPN Monthly Management Report

- The PPN has developed working groups for specific issues to support the Representative on Committees. There is now a working group for Social Inclusion whose members are working towards increasing public awareness of community development and training in Co. Kilkenny. An Environment working group who have made a submission to the National Biodiversity Plan, and a linkage group to support the representative of the South East Drug and Alcohol Task Force. A working group for disabilities is in the forming stages who will take the lead in the pursuit of Gold Star Universal access for all, in Kilkenny, a HSE disabilities awareness initiative.
- A free members training programme is underway in meetings management, strategic Planning and grant writing. Six PPN members have just been awarded PPN champion scholarship places to undertake a Degree in Business, Social Enterprise and Community Development. This is the first such PPN programme in the country that Kilkenny and Tipperary PPN are co-funding through EQUAL Ireland.
- Six members of the Kilkenny PPN attended the Community Connects Conference in Waterford in March. A very worthwhile and informative event that covered every aspect of running a community organisations from governance to social enterprise. We are hoping that a similar event will take place in kilkenny next year.
- The PPN have applied for funding in conjunction with the older peoples forum through the Ireland Fund to host a conference on engaging older adults to become more active at local government level.

- The PPN and the Community section have joined forces to promote and financially support the Street Feast initiative. The National Street Feast day will be held on Sunday the 11th June to promote community cohesion through social lunches held in communities throughout the county. Street Feast information packs and insurance will be funded through this collaboration.
- A comprehensive work plan for the PPN 2017 has been developed and adopted by the secretariat pending full ratification by all members at the next PPN plenary in Kilkenny on the 25th April.
- The first PPN plenary of 2017 will be held in the Ormonde Hotel at 7pm on the 25th of April and will include presentations on funding opportunities as well as round table discussions by PPN representatives on issues that as of interest to members.

Pride of Place 2017

- To support the contributions made by local, voluntary community groups and to afford recognition of the critical role played by such groups in local communities, Kilkenny County Council has set aside €8000 in the 2017 Budget to enable four applications to be made to Pride of Place 2017. The four applications include one per Electoral District in County Kilkenny.
- The closing date for receipt of applications is 5th May, 2017 and the four Community Groups going forward to represent County Kilkenny in the 2017 Pride of Place Competition are;

The 2017 Pride of Place Awards Ceremony will be held in Letterkenny, County Donegal in December 2017.

CLÁR 2017

The Department has announced €5m in funding for the CLÁR Scheme for 2017. The Scheme is divided into four different measures with specific funding allocation for each as follows:

Measure 1: Support for Schools/Community Measures [€2m] CLÁR will support intervention to make school/community facility environs healthier and safer for all users.

An application will be required from the school/community group and applications will be facilitated by each of the Municipal Engineers. Closing date for receipt of applications to the Council is 28th April, 2017. All applications received by the Council to be submitted to the Department of Environment, Community & Local Government before 5th May, 2017.

Measure 2: School/Community Play Areas CLÁR will support the enhancement of existing or development of new school/community play areas. Projects proposed will require an application, relevant permission and details of ownership amongst others. Clear evidence of need and relevance to LECP/other plans must be demonstrated.

The minimum grant aid is $\notin 5,000$ and maximum is $\notin 50,000$. Maximum funding of 90% of the project will be provided with a minimum contribution of 5% from the school/community.

Measure 3: Targeted Community Infrastructure Needs [€1.5m]

CLÁR will support applications for small capital/infrastructure projects that don't qualify for other existing schemes. Applicants must demonstrate that the project is <u>NOT</u> eligible for assistance under existing schemes. Clear evidence of need and benefit to the community must be demonstrated along with relevance to the LECP/other Plan.

The minimum grant aid is $\notin 5,000$ and maximum is $\notin 50,000$. Maximum funding of 85% of the project will be provided with a minimum contribution of 5% from the school/community.





Measure 4: First Response Support Measure [€0.75m]

Applications for this Scheme are to be made directly to the Department of Environment, Community & Local Government

ARTS

Quarterly Report – January to March 2017

Art Links Bursaries

11 applications for ArtLinks were received, an increase on 2016. The applications made related to projects in literature, theatre, visual arts, music and film. An external assessor selected 8 successful applicants.

Arts Act Grants

A total of 38 applications were made from Kilkenny individual artists and arts groups for the Arts Act Grants. 25 grants were awarded to a total amount of $\notin 21,510$.

Tyrone Guthrie Residency Bursary

10 applications were received for the Tyrone Guthrie Centre bursary. 4 bursaries were awarded to support projects in visual art and literature/playwriting.

• The Moth Young Artists & Writers Bursary Two bursaries for a week long stary at The Moth Retreat, Co. Cavan, were awarded to support projects in music and in scriptwriting in Irish.

• Schools Subsidy for theatre visit 12 primary schools in Co. Kilkenny availed of our annual subsidy to help bring pupils to "Star Chasers" at the Barnstorm Theatre.

Siamsa Programme

The Sprint Siamsa Programme has been completed. 24 places were available. The first 3 workshops introduced the building blocks of sculpture, moving from flat drawings to 3D creations. The second 3-week block focused on printmaking techniques and pattern-making in print.

Kilkenny Poetry Broadsheet

After a very successful 2016 Broadsheet, Kimberley Campanello has been invited to edit the 2017 issue of the Poetry Broadsheet and to run a workshop to prepare Kilkenny writers for Broadsheet submissions by teaching poetry writing techniques, self editing, etc. The workshop has taken place and feedback from participants has been very positive. The deadline for submissions for the Broadsheet 2017 is 21st April, 2017.

• Literature programme - Rhyme Rag

- Rhyme Rag outreach: The poet Stephen Murray taught 4 workshops in Kilkenny secondary schools in which a total of 245 students took part. The workshops took place in Loreto Secondary School, CBS Kilkenny, Grennan College Thomastown and Presentation Secondary School, Loughboy.
- Rhyme Rag Ensemble: In addition to the online platform, Rhyme Rag now has a writers' group, the Ensemble, a partnership between Kilkenny Arts Office and Ossory Youth. The Ensemble meets on a monthly basis at Ossory Youth. An inaugural workshop for young writers aged 14-17 took place on 11th March with another workshop planned for April with Enda Coyle-Greene.
- In March a window display was set up in St. Canice's Credit Union on High Street for one week to promote the Rhyme Rag and the Rhyme Rag Ensemble activities. The next display will be in September 2017.





- Number of our young poets joined Arts Officer Mary Butler and Nuala Roche for an interview on Kilkenny Community Radio.
- Open Circle Programme
 - Open Circle Arts continues to provide quality arts learning for the women of Kilkenny, engaging with local artists - Julie Cusack, Julie Moorhouse and Saturio Alonso early in 2017.
 - o Open Circle is collaborating with theatre maker Ita Morrissey on 'The Consuming Project'- a project that looks at fashion and how our global society is consuming more than ever before, but where is it all going? What do we know about how, where and who made our clothes and how are we coping with the waste it generates. This is a community based project which has been engaging with the women in Open Circle wider community through and the discussion workshops and designing and making a costumed set for a public performance in July of this year. The project being documented is photographically and with а video highlighting the issues involved, the documenting of the project is funded by a from Kilkenny Co Council grant Environment Office. The collaboration was publicised in an interview on KCLR in March.
 - Literature workshops planned for later in the year following on from a successful series of beginner's creative writing workshops in late 2016.
 - Open Circle is publishing a booklet in May of the work of the women involved in the project in 2016/2017.

• Music Generation

Music Generation Kilkenny – A number of meetings have taken place and the working group is currently preparing the application.

A very successful information briefing in Grennan College took place on 30th March organized by Kilkenny County Council and Kilkenny & Carlow ETB.

Bookville

Preparation for the joint Kilkenny Arts Office/Kilkenny Library Childrens' Book Festival "Bookville" which takes place in October 2017 is ongoing. Award winning illustrator, Chris Judge, has developed the Festival visuals.

Implementation of National Library Management System:

Kilkenny Library Service are now part of a new national library system, allowing library members access to any of Ireland's public library collections with one single library membership card. The introduction of this new system, called Sierra, is the first of its kind in Europe and provides significant benefits to the public which include having access to a much wider range of books, film, and music from across the country. Members can now borrow and reserve up to 12 items at a time, from any library in Ireland.

New Initiative: Work Matters



Work Matters promotes the public library as a space to support the information and research

needs for people seeking employment, changing career or up skilling or people involved in business. The range of free services and supports that the library service provides includes a collection of business and employment related titles, online training programmes and digital resources, access to free Wi-Fi and public internet machines and a scanning and printing facility. As part of this initiative, we held an Information evening for local businesses and job seekers. Agencies involved were Intreo, Kilkenny ETB, LEO, Citizens Information, Kilkenny Leader Partnership, Bank of Ireland Graiguenamanagh, Graiguenamanagh Credit Union, Turas Nua, Kilkenny Jobs Club and Duiske College.

Programming:

National Aontas Festival

Kilkenny Library Service held 8 events for Aontas Adult Learners festival this year, with two well attended talks on The Camino walk, and six drop in Information sessions in libraries to introduce learners to our new suite of over 500 free online courses. These were a huge success.

St. Patricks Festival/Tradfest



Kilkenny Library Service participated with Gulliver's Travels Comic drawing sessions with Oisin McGann, and four St. Patrick's Themed storytimes in library branches.





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One Book One Community



Graiguenamanagh Library partnered with 11 local schools in a very successful One Book One Community initiative. Based on Nicola Pierce's "Spirit of The Titanic", the library hosted a Titanic Tea Party, Skype Quizzes, Table Quizzes, Author Readings and much more.

The bank overdraft facility has not been utilized during the three months to the end of March.

The Annual Financial Statement for 2016 has been finalised and will be presented to Council at the April meeting. The annual audit by the Local Government Auditor will be completed in the coming months.
