Categories

- 1. Groups and Organisations promoting arts
- Kilkenny County Council will consider applications from organisations involved in the promotion of the arts in Kilkenny.
- 2. Individual Artists all Art forms
- Kilkenny County Council will consider applications from practising artists living in Kilkenny to enable them to pursue their practice and to develop within their chosen discipline, including professional development and project awards

An application for a grant may be made under one of the above categories only. Groups and individuals can only make one application for an Arts Act Grants annually.



NOT TOO PRECIOUS 22 JANUARY 2016 – 30 MARCH 2016

Not Too Precious explores inspirational work by 25 international jewellers using materials for their expressive potential rather than for their intrinsic value. Today, the use of a huge variety of materials in jewellery is far more accepted, but economic pressures are putting that freedom of artistic expression at potential risk as people revert to traditionally 'valuable' materials for 'safety'. Not Too Precious challenges preconceptions about 'non-precious' materials by encouraging us to consider 'accrued value': what talented makers bring to their work through their ideas and skill.

Scoil Nioclais, Frankfield, Cork City intend to commission a public art work/s under the Percent for Art Scheme funded by the Department of Education and Science on the occasion of its significant redesign and redevelopment by Ed Rafferty of Reddy Architecture.

It is intended that the commissioned art work/s will be site specific will be integrated into the redevelopment and or sited in and or around the building or grounds. The brief asks the artist to:

Reflect the ethos and ambition of the School; its commitment to education and knowledge sharing, respond to the redeveloped site and its redevelopment and reflect the meaningful interaction between staff and students

Budget: €32,000 inclusive of all artists' fees and costs including installation; VAT, insurance etc. The opportunity is open to all professional artists.

Commissioning Process: This is a two-stage open commission and will be managed by the National Sculpture Factory, Cork

Competition Jury: There will be a five member Jury Panel that will include two representatives of the School, the project architect, and two nominees of the National Sculptural Factory.

Molly Keane Creative Writing Award 2016



Waterford City & County Council's Arts Office is pleased to announce that it is currently accepting entries for the Molly Keane Creative Writing Award 2016.

The late writer lived, until her death in 1996, in Ardmore, Co. Waterford. Her first ten novels and four plays were published under the pseudonym M.J. Farrell. In 1981 'Good Behaviour' became a publishing sensation for which she was short listed for the prestigious Booker Prize. Annually since 1998, to celebrate this rich literary life, the Waterford Arts Office, by kind permission of the Keane family has invited entries for a previously unpublished short story to a maximum of 2000 words. There is no entry fee, no age limit and no restriction on the subject matter. A prize of €500 will be awarded to the winner at a special ceremony during the IMMRAMA Literary Festival in Lismore, Co. Waterford in June 2016.
