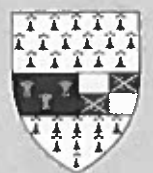

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## **1. Introduction**

This report forms part of the statutory procedure for the making of Variation 3 to the Kilkenny County Development Plan (KCDP).

This report addresses the submissions received during the 4 week public consultation period, from the 24<sup>th</sup> January to the 21<sup>st</sup> February 2018, in relation to the Proposed Variation.

The purpose of this report is to:

- summarise the written submissions/observations received in relation to the proposed variation during the public consultation period.
- set out the Chief Executive's response to the issues raised in the submissions/observations and;
- make recommendations to the Elected Members on the issues arising from the consultation process.

This report is being furnished to the Elected Members of Kilkenny County Council in accordance with Section 13(4) of the Planning and Development Act 2000, as amended, for their consideration.

### **1.1 Proposed Variation**

Variation No. 3 to the Kilkenny County Development Plan proposes:

- (a) Incorporating the expired Local Area Plan areas of Piltown, Fiddown and Gowran into the County Development Plan with settlement boundaries in accordance with Section 3.3.5.1 of the County Development Plan
- (b) Extending the settlement boundary of the Ballyragget area in order to facilitate housing development

V2	EPA (Cian O'Mahony, Scientific Officer)	This submission requests that the Agency's previous submission in relation to Proposed Variation No. 3, made to the Notice of Proposed Variation for SEA <sup>2</sup> should be taken into account at this time also. That submission sought that: 1) Any proposed development should be carried out in a manner that is consistent with the County Core Strategy and with the principles of sustainable development. 2) Where changes to the Variation are made prior to finalisation, or where modifications to the Plan are proposed following its adoption, these should be screened for potential for likely significant effects. 3) Adequate and appropriate infrastructure should be in place, or required to be put in place, to service any development proposed and authorised during the lifetime of the Plan.
<b>Response</b> 1) Variation is consistent with the Core Strategy and with sustainable development. 2) Noted. 3) Noted, the adequacy of infrastructure will be assessed as part of any planning application.

V3	Transport Infrastructure Ireland (Michael McCormack, Senior Land Use Planner)	1) TII notes proposals outlined in proposed variation no. 3 (b) to include a new objective concerning access to the N77 (objective 3S01). While TII has no objection in principle to this, they request that such additional connectivity to the national road network should ensure the strategic function of the national road network is safeguarded in accordance with the provisions of the DoECLG Spatial Planning and National Roads Guidelines (2012) and Section 11.7.3 of the County Development Plan, 2014-2020. 2) In relation to the incorporation of Settlement Plans for Fiddown, Gowran and Piltown into the Development Plan, the Council will be aware that the

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	settlement boundary for Piltown extends into the Constraints Study Area for the N24 Carrick on Suir Bypass, the delivery of which is an objective of the adopted Development Plan.



### **3. Summary of Recommendations of the Chief Executive**

Of the 6 submissions received, 4 supported the proposed variation without qualification.
