RE: ARTS ACT GRANTS 2021

A Chara,

In approving the 2021 Budget Elected Members have provided an allocation in the amount of €22,000 for the assignment of the Arts Grants in 2020.

This recognises the provisions of the Arts Act 2003 whereby individual local authorities may provide financial assistance for the purposes of:

- Stimulating interest in the Arts
- Promoting knowledge and/ or appreciation of the Arts
- Enhancing standards in the Arts

Kilkenny County Council also supports Residency Programmes annually a cost of €5,400 with the balance in the amount of €16,600 under the Arts Grant Scheme.

The expression "the Arts" means creative or interpretative expression (traditional or contemporary) in whatever form and includes in particular visual arts, theatre, literature, music, film, dance and Multi- disciplinary events.

The Arts Office advertised the 2021 Arts Grants process in December 2020 with a deadline for receipt of applications of 18th January 2021. The following represent the categories of applicants to which grant allocations can be awarded:

- Groups and organisations promoting the Arts
- Individual Artists - all art forms - to enable them to pursue their practice, to develop within their chosen discipline and deliver projects.

A total of 15 applications were received to a total value of €14,595 to assist with the assessment of the applications an assessment panel was convened on 10th February 2021 to assess the grant applications. The assessment panel included:

- Ann Mulrooney, Cultural consultant
- Eamonn Maxwell, Curator and Cultural Consultant
- Mary Butler, Arts Officer was present

I recommend that the grants as outlined under the Arts Act Grant 2020 are approved by the members as circulated.
