- In 2022, in Kilkenny, 72% of households owned their own home, with a further 23% renting. This compared with 66% of households owning their home nationally and 28% renting.
- Average asking price in County Kilkenny for a house is €295,585
- 7.6% lower than the national average of €320,046 and 20.6% lower than in Dublin City Centre where the average asking price is €372,260.

- Average cost of monthly rental accommodation in Kilkenny is €1,411 (across all property types)
- 22.6% lower than the national monthly average of €1,823 and 39.1% lower than the average monthly rent in Dublin City Centre at €2,317.
- There are currently 17 properties for rent in County Kilkenny, with 3 properties advertised in Kilkenny city. (daft.ie)

- In December 2023, there were a total of 48 multi-unit housing developments with live planning permissions secured within Kilkenny City
- Within these schemes there are 2,210 permitted housing units.
- 19 housing schemes are either active or built out in the City with valid commencement notices for 637 units
- In December 2023 within Ferrybank and the larger county towns a total of 24 multi-unit housing developments have planning permission.
- Within these schemes there are permissions for 535 housing units. 12 housing schemes are active or built out with valid commencement notices for 242 units
- In addition to the above granted permissions there are currently 31 multi-unit development applications in the Kilkenny County Council Planning system
 - These could potentially yield a further 597 units for the county. 138 are in the City, 348 are located in the Local Area Plan towns, and 111 are in smaller villages / settlements of the county.

- The Labour force participation rate in Kilkenny among people aged 15 and over was just over 60% in 2022.
- There were 46,196 people (aged 15 and over) at work in Kilkenny in 2022, an increase of 4,833 or 12% from 2016.
 Nationally, there was an increase of 16% from 2016.
- In Kilkenny, 12,906 people (aged 15 and over) worked from home at least one day a week in 2022. This
 represented 28% of the workforce. The national figure was 32%.
- The seasonally adjusted national unemployment rate for December 2023 (for all persons aged 15-74 years) was 4.9%. This is up slightly from 4.4% in December 2022.
- The number of people on the live register in Kilkenny in December 2023 was 2,410. This figure was 2891 at December 2022.
- Kilkenny was amongst the counties that saw the largest percentage decrease in the number of persons on the Live Register in the 12 months to December 2023 at -15.1%, alongside Cavan (-15.7%) and Kerry (-11.6%)




