Context and Demographics



- Ireland is experiencing a significant increase in its ageing population
- There were 15,843 people aged 65 and over living in Kilkenny in 2022. Of these 3,815 were living alone. This was an 19% increase in those aged 65 and over living alone from the previous Census.
- The number of people aged 65 years and over set to increase significantly in Ireland, the number of people in this age category set to reach over 1 million by 2030 and reaching 1.6 million by 2051
- This increase in the older population is having a significant impact on various aspects of Irish society, including health, social services, and the economy.

This action will focus on exploring the scope and capacity to provide dedicated Age Friendly housing developments in Kilkenny based on best practice models from elsewhere in Ireland and overseas. This will be done through ALONE's Support and Befriending service and Community Connector service and other initiatives that are well positioned to provide direct contact to isolated older people. Action 6.1 Hosting Age Friendly Information Events	Information provision is key to ensuring that older people are aware of the wide range of support services and activities that are available to them locally. This action will undertake a series of open information events across the county bringing all service providers together to present the range of supports available to local older people. Action 7.1 Promoting Kilkenny Age Friendly Business Recognition Programme	This action will see the ongoing development and promotion of the Kilkenny Age Friendly Business Recognition Programme across the city and county. This will include supporting local businesses to integrate Age Friendly supports and services into their businesses and also the continued inclusion of an Age Friendly category in the annual Chamber awards programme.
