2. Consideration of Reports and Recommendations:

(a) Broadband

Mr Martin Prendiville updated members as follows:

- Cellnex are in discussions with the property owner.
- Mr Steve Coverdale is in discussions with an alternative broadband provider for former Bank of Ireland building, Urlingford.

Members agreed that:

- In future, a bi-monthly broadband update will be provided.
- Mr Steve Coverdale will be requested to provide a user's guide on how to switch to fibre broadband at the February MD meeting.

(b) Old Fire Station, Urlingford – NAS & HSE Presentation

Representatives from the NAS and the HSE presented proposals to set up an outlying standby point for the NAS at Urlingford's Old Fire Station. The presentation provided details as follows:

- Key benefits including; close proximity to M8, reduced response times and service needs in the area.
- Emerging threats for the team.
- EA Standby Point.
- Dynamic Deployment Model.
- Future Models.

Contributions were received from the members as follows:

- Members agreed that having an outlying ambulance standby point in Urlingford would be of massive benefit to the area saying such a move would make people's lives safer.
- Clarity was sought on use of the service during unsocial hours, increased noise and staffing of the service.
- Disappointment of local residents that the location had been ruled out as an access point for the adjoining estate was acknowledged.
- The NAS and HSE were thanked for the excellent service which they provide.
- The importance of knowing your Eircode was highlighted.

Members were advised that staffing of the new facility would be a demand lead service, there is no increase in noise foreseen in the general area and it is not envisaged to be used during unsocial hours.

Cllr Mary Hilda Cavanagh confirmed that the Castlecomer Municipal District members will be recommending to the Plenary Council that the provision of this outlying standby point for the NAS at the Old Fire Station, Urlingford proceeds.
