- (a) Public Lighting Scheme Coon

Mr Philippe Beubry provided details of a public lighting scheme ready to go, subject to members approval for Coon which involves the provision of 5 lights between Coon National School and the entrance to the GAA pitch at a cost of €20,000, which, if approved, will be charged to the Discretionary General Budget.

(b) Ballyragget Development Association – Pedestrianising the Old Bridge in Ballyragget

Mr Beubry confirmed he was in favour of proceeding with the request on health grounds and confirmed the formal procedure will be followed, if approved.

It was proposed by Cllr Mary Hilda Cavanagh, seconded by Cllr Michael Delaney and agreed that the procedure to pedestrianise the Old Bridge, Ballyragget proceed.
