The resolution was then put to the meeting and respectfully passed in silence, all present standing.

3. Presentation by Marian Flannery, St. Patrick's Day Parade Committee, Kilkenny.

Marian Flannery, Event Organiser of the Kilkenny City St. Patrick's Day Parade gave a presentation to the Members explaining the background to the festivities that will take place in 2016, the committee structure currently in place, the importance of the Parade from a tourism perspective, details of the numbers attending the Parade in recent years and the funding of the Parade.

Mr. Michael Young, Event Controller, outlined the requirements in relation to the physical organising of the event.

Members thanked Ms. Flannery and Mr. Young for their presentations and agreed that funding for the St. Patrick's Day Parade in Kilkenny City should come from the Council's central funds and the event should become a Civic Event.

Following a discussion it was agreed that the Members of the Municipal District of Kilkenny City would call on the Corporate Policy Group to discuss the matter of funding for the Parade at the next available CPG Meeting with a view to bringing a recommendation before the full Council.

4. Twinning Agreement with Formigine, Italy.

Cllr. Malcolm Noonan explained the background to the twinning request from Formigine, Italy.

Members discussed the possibility of allocating funding from the General Municipal Allocation and requested information on the benefits of having a twinning arrangement in place.

5. Roads Works Scheme 2016.

Mr. Seamus Kavanagh advised the Members that a scheme would be drawn up and organised to meet with the Members of both Electoral Areas in the coming weeks with a view to having a Schedule of Municipal Works available for adoption at the March Monthly Meeting of the Municipal District.

6. Land Use Proposal for Fairgreen, Callan.

Mr. Simon Walton circulated a map of the proposals for the development of Fairgreen area in Callan, following consultation and discussions with John Lockes GAA Club and Callan Soccer Club.

Members queried the provision of public lighting, the illustration of same on the map and the provision of funding to get plan up and running. Mr. Simon Walton advised that he will come back to the Members will recommendation for funding from the Remedial Works budget and there may be a possibility of funding from the recently announced Urban and Village Renewal Scheme announced by Minister Ann Phelan.

7. School Safety Audit and Assessment of Traffic Calming Measures adjacent to Schools.

It was agreed to defer this item to a future meeting.

8. Consultant's Report on in-river works in Callan.

Mr. Seamus Foley advised the Members that the Consultants assigned to assess the in-river works are of the opinion that the works are not significant and the matter has now been referred to the Central Applications Unit of the Department of Environment, Community and Local Government for their comments.
