## 3. Nuashonrú ar athbhreithniú ar Phlean Ceantair Áitiúil Callan Update on review of Callan Local Area Plan.

Mr. Nicolaas Louw, Senior Executive Planner, gave a progress update on both Callan and Thomastown Local Area Plans and the context of the plan within the Regional Spatial and Economic Strategy Roadmap under the National Planning Framework. The aim is to have the plans adopted by April 2019.

Ms. Aislinn O'Brien from SLR Consulting provided a more detailed briefing on the Callan LAP. She:

- i) Reviewed Progress and Timelines for the Plan
- ii) Provided the key considerations for preparing the Draft Plan
- iii) Described the emerging development strategy

The Members thanked Aislinn for her presentation and raised the following queries/observations:

- Status of lands where previous planning permission has expired.
- Status of zoning of lands.
- Premises that should be return to full occupancy in Callan Town Centre.
- Need to focus on Bridge Street.
- Serviced sites in around the Town Centre for private housing.
- Opportunity for developing Tourism in the Town.
- Public owned land in the Town and the development of this land.
- Role of the recently announced National Development Agency.
- Delivery of housing in Callan.
- · Vacant buildings in the Town.

Ms. Aislinn O'Brien, Mr. Dennis Malone, Mr Nicolaas Louw and Mr. Tim Butler addressed all the queries. Mr. Dennis Malone explained to the Members that the Local Area Plan would be bought back to members before the plan is published.

  - IW will consult with the businesses on the street regarding individual connections.
  - Road will not be closed and works will be managed by Traffic Management (Stop/Go system).
  - Curbing of the footpath will take place in November followed by full resurfacing of the Road.

Mr. Tim Butler and Ms Emir Slattery responded to all queries. Information around the application for funding for works to be carried out in Callan and the works been carried out at the Junctions off the bypass was provided. It was also stressed that the cleanup of the Lane ways in Kilkenny would only be carried out once and was not an excuse for people to dump their rubbish. The Department has still not responded to the application for funding for repairs to roads after Storm Emma.
