The Mayor:

- Following a number of requests from the public, the Mayor recommended that the Saturday Farmers Market continue throughout the Summer period as it forms an attraction of its own for the City and it's also beneficial for local businesses.

Contributions in relation to the Saturday market were received from Cllr. Martin Brett, Cllr. Joe Malone, Cllr. Eugene McGuinness and Cllr Marie Dollard.

Tim Butler, Director of Services responded to the proposal and advised that the Members can extend the Market period and recommend that it run from the 2nd of June to the end of September.

- A letter was received from the Mayor of Dolyna City in the Ukraine thanking the people of Kilkenny City for all the work and generosity afforded to its people. The Ukrainian Mayor also set out a proposal to twin Dolyna City with Kilkenny City.

- Cllr. Andrew McGuinness expressed his concern with Irish Rails handling of a request to remove debris from Lacken Drive pedestrian access walkway which runs adjacent to the railway track. Mr. McGuinness advised the Members that there is a lack of response and care shown for the residents of Lacken Drive who use the walkway.

Mr. Ian Gardner, Senior Engineer responded to Cllr. McGuinness advising that Irish Rail contacted Kilkenny County Council and advised that they will return to clear the debris and return the walkway to its former state shortly.

- Cllr. Andrew McGuinness spoke about Local Authority grass cutting throughout the City, specifically the tradition of cutting grass throughout City Estates.

Mr. Ian Gardner advised the Mayor that he is available at any time to discuss the cutting of grass throughout the City.
